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1) Call to Order

Meeting was called to order by at 2:05.

2) Annual Charter Review and Approval

3) Annual Workplan Review

The workgroup reviewed the annual workplan and moved some items, due to time constraints.

- The workgroup felt that it was important to review the membership and look at gaps in representation sooner rather than later.
- The general membership meeting is tentatively scheduled for June, pending completion of the charter amendments and the website updates. Debra Lee committed to having paralegal training on Federally funded programs. Long term care was a program that the group felt is important to cover as there is a lot of confusion about it.
- Equal housing and fair housing training requirements were discussed, it was decided that the two training courses could be combined, and that the Fair Housing Council of Oregon's online zoom

trainings that are scheduled to take place during the month of April, which is also Fair Housing month could count toward Fair Housing Training.
